- Low-income women of all racial, ethnic, educational, and religious backgrounds.
- Premature & special needs babies.
- Unsupported mothers.
- Homeless women and babies.
- Victims of domestic violence or substance abuse.
- Families with medical problems or job loss.

There are over 500 babies born in Clark & Cowlitz Counties every month. About thirty of them need our help!

How Did We Begin?

In 1999, people at All Saints Episcopal Church, Vancouver, WA, responded to the plight of women with newborns who don't have even the basics for their care.

We reached out in love by assembling large layette gift packs and taking them to the Family Birth Center at PeaceHealth Medical Center and later to Legacy Salmon Creek Hospital. We also took car seats.

Social Workers match our layettes and car seats with mothers and babies who need them.

Local churches, clubs, civic groups, scouts, and individuals have joined the effort. We've given over 5400 layettes, 2800 car seats, and 900 sibling bags to needy families in Southwest Washington.
